- Fixation and registration requirements as a historic barrier for minority artists and composers
- Lack of general public performance right for sound recordings led to undercompensation of minority artists
- Lack of adequate representation and bargaining power for minority artists; Atlantic Records as the "House that Ruth Built"

∉ Efforts to treat artists more equitably (10 min; Susan Moultrie)

- Sony's Legacy Unrecouped Balance Program
- Sony's "Artist Forward" initiative (e.g., health and wellness benefits; health care advocacy, transparency with royalty statements)
- Increased negotiation of artist deal terms
- Duration of artist agreements have become shorter

∉ Shift from physical to digital distribution (10 min)

- Latest data on sources of revenues from music recordings
- Changes from royalty model to license model
- Lower distribution costs
- Importance of international distribution
- Importance of social media virality

Recent changes to artist agreements and copyright ownership (10 min)

- Rise of independent labels and direct distribution models
- Increased reliance on ancillary revenue streams (e.g., merchandise, brand partnerships, social media, NFTs, touring, etc.)
- Exclusive recording clauses and re-recording restrictions
